

Macungie Memorial Park

On September 1, 1944, twenty-one acres of land was purchased and the Macungie Memorial Park Association was incorporated as a charitable non-profit organization on November 27, 1944. Construction of the park bandshell was completed in time for a Memorial Day concert on May 30, 1949, and the Veterans Memorial was dedicated on May 30, 1952. Today, the park continues to serve the greater Macungie community, not only as a wonderful place for public gatherings, but also as a living memorial to the men and women of this community who served the cause of freedom in the armed forces of our country.



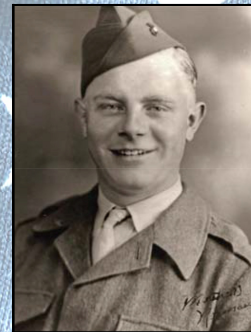
All Gave Some - Some Gave All Memorial

The "All Gave Some - Some Gave All" memorial, located at the Macungie Veterans Association, was dedicated on May 25, 1997. It was erected by the members of Post 75, Veterans of the Vietnam War, and Chapter 415, Vietnam Veterans of America, as a way to memorialize all veterans of Lehigh and Northampton Counties. The Memorial encompasses all branches of the armed services from any era of American history.

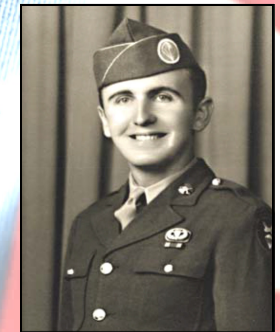
