

## Sheeprock Trek History

Today marks the 93rd year of Sheeprock Trek, an annual observance first described in a 1929 Allentown *Morning Call* article as “a novel undertaking.” Bill Shoemaker, a local civic leader, state legislator, and founder of the first Macungie Boy Scout Troop, organized the Trek in 1929 as an activity sponsored by the Young People’s Council of Solomon’s Reformed Church. Sheeprock was chosen for the annual pilgrimage because from that point on the mountain “a magnificent view over all the territory north, east, and west may be enjoyed.”

The origin of the name Sheeprock, or Sheep Stable, was derived from local folklore, when a farmer, caught in an unexpected storm, led his sheep to shelter in a cave below the rocky summit of the mountain. This cave served as a stable, or shelter, from the cold north wind.

The Sheep Stable received national attention in the 1915 novel, *Katy Gaumer*, by local author Elsie Singmaster: “at the summit of the little mountain, there was a rough pile of rocks which formed a tiny cairn or cave. Before it was a small platform, parapeted by a great boulder. Generations past had named the spot... the Sheep Stable.... Far to the right lay the county seat; ... far away against the horizon rose the Blue Ridge with its three gaps where the Lehigh and the Schuylkill and the Delaware Rivers made their way through its barrier to the sea. Directly below lay [Macungie], thickly shaded, still.”

Macungie historian O.P. Knauss chronicled the Trek during the early years, writing; “Few scenes anywhere are as glorious and inspiring, and at early sunrise the view is particularly beautiful.” That fact is as true today as it was in 1929, and is the single most reason that this Thanksgiving service has survived for the past 93 years. As we once again gather together in observance of this unique Macungie tradition, let us give thanks for the opportunity to again enjoy what Knauss first called “a scene which never fails to incite wonder and delight.”

Special thanks go to the Macungie Historical Society for their work in preparing the program for today's service; and to the members of the Macungie Volunteer Fire Department for graciously opening their facilities for us this Thanksgiving morning.
